# **Rector's Report**

Like many of you, one of my hopes for 2022 was for *more*: more normalcy, more fellowship, and more time to explore together how to do God's work in the world.

As I look back, we certainly have been blessed by *so much more* than I could have asked for or imagined. There's been a return of so many to our regular Sunday worship, with the joy of marvelous musical additions for Christmas and Easter and the delight of our children's choir. We're strengthening our ability to be welcoming through our *Saints Alive!* Greeters and the new *Friends* ministry. Fellowship and community-wide activities are back, with Monthly potlucks, Wine & Cheese, English Tea, MarketPlace, and parish picnics. We've had engaging conversations during our group studies and seasonal programs, from Episcopal 101 to Advent and Lenten offerings and seasonal retreats, as well as faithful small group gatherings: the Monday Book Group, Education for Ministry, and Celebrating the Saints. Our Food Pantry continues to serve the wider community, Breaking Barriers is growing, and we are faithful supporters of Family Promise.

But there's also been something else happening at All Saints: a growing ability to deeply listen to the nudgings of the Spirit, for the Spirit is with us. In so many ways, 2022 has been a year of discernment for our community.

Discernment took place for some individuals. Dominique Deming, began a time of Holy Listening about vocational discernment for the priesthood, engaging with discernment teams from both the Diocese and our Parish. I'm pleased to announce that Dominique is now a postulant to the priesthood, attending seminary at Candler School of Theology in Atlanta. All Saints also has another member, Paul Davison, participating in the new Diocesan FAB (Formation for All the Baptized) program, a licensure process for lay ministers that involves discernment and formation. Paul will soon to be commissioned as a licensed lay minister in several areas, including lay preacher and pastoral leader.

Discernment also took place within the community and I'm thrilled that All Saints continues to explore new ways of sharing Christ's light by leaning into our gifts of hospitality. We're committed to our digital presence, and finding new ways to welcome the wider community to All Saints. We've opened ourselves to new possibilities of getting to know our neighbors by walking in the neighborhood and we're actively engaging with the City of Warner Robins in the new Homelessness Initiative. We remain hopeful that Holly House will become a reality in 2023. New possibilities abound, as we trust in Christ Jesus to lead us in His way of love.

There's a real openness at All Saints to listen and experiment and try new ways to use our God-given talents to carry Christ's light into the world. This openness is a wonderful sign of health and resiliency, despite the challenges in our lives. I'm grateful to be your Rector and a part of this beloved, generous community, as we strive to live with hearts wide open to God's possibilities.

# Senior Warden's Report

The year 2022 gave us an opportunity to Restart, Re-engage, and Renew. Thanks be to God! When we started the year, we did not know what the future would bring. We were so disappointed to cancel our 2022 Annual Meeting. Thankfully, we were soon able to move forward, enjoy fellowship, and work to fulfill our mission in our Church and our Community.

The contribution of the entire congregation of their time, talent, and treasure made 2022 a time of growth. Ellen Strait steered the Stewardship campaign that has left this Church in good standing for 2023. We are so blessed to have such a generous congregation.

We were able to restart so many activities and projects. We will never take for granted being able to gather together. We were once again able to worship together in our beloved church. Under the direction of Kipp Gill, the choir once again filled the church with music. We returned to covered-dish luncheons and were able to have programs for Lent and Advent. We worshiped together on Sundays, Pilgrimage on Wednesdays, Veteran's Day, Election Day, and many more.

Our ECW brought back projects such as the Wine and Cheese, English Tea, Marketplace, Shawl Ministry, and much more. Recently ECW was able to donate a total of \$10,000 to community non-profit organizations because of the success of these projects. We were so pleased to have Rev. Shirley Porter with us as we resumed the Annual Women's Retreat. We are so fortunate to have Linda Christie and her band of helpers. The "W" in ECW may stand for Women, but we are always so grateful for the support of the Men of our congregation. They seem to show up just when we need them.

Maintaining our facility is often a "challenge." Many projects have been completed and others remain on the list. Our Junior Warden, Susan Wynn, has maintained a list of priorities and accomplished so much. We were fortunate to be able to obtain an additional grant from the Georgia Interfaith Power and Light that will be used to improve our lighting.

Through the leadership of our College of Congregational Development Team, we have continued our greeter program to make sure everyone is graciously welcomed to All Saints. We have started a new program, Friends Ministry, to connect with visitors and help them not just at the front door, but through the entire Sunday Worship.

As the Food Pantry continued through the year, it was apparent that the church could step in to address other needs. Deacon Barbara has been instrumental in establishing Breaking Barriers. The goal is to help people obtain items such as birth certificates and social security cards and also connect with other resources in the community. The lack of proper identification has been a barrier to many people as they strive to become independent. Breaking Barriers has been able to connect people to resources that can change their life.

Outreach has been an important part of life at All Saints in 2022 and promises to be an even bigger part in 2023. We have continued to support Family Promise with meals and donations. Our partnership with Trinity Methodist Church will continue through 2023. We are able to work with the schools again, and we are excited to work with Westside Elementary. We started an initiative to get to know our neighbors through the "Getting to Know Our Neighbors" program and invited them to join us for various activities such as Trunk or Treat. We learned more about our neighborhood demographics through a computer program called MapDash.

As we reach out into the community, we are blessed to work with the Homelessness Coalition. A temporary Warming Center has been established at our neighbor church, The Table. We have supported them with food donations. There are many opportunities to volunteer for this group. Eventually, the city will be establishing a permanent shelter that will be open year-round. Many of the homeless in our community are employed but unable to afford housing as prices have risen. We are blessed to join with so many churches, businesses, and organizations as our community comes together to address homelessness.

I feel very honored to have served as Senior Warden in 2022. I am so grateful for all of the support I have received from this congregation. A special note of appreciation for Mother Bonnie and her support and leadership. Also, a note to Deacon Barbara for all she does to expand our connection to the community. We are so grateful to have Linda Gerdes once again serving as our Parish Administrator. I feel so blessed to continue to serve with Vestry members Barbara Attaway, Linda Christie, Linda Gerdes, Judy Reynolds, and Anne Sanders. Sally Engels, Marcia Fussell, Ellen Strait, and Susan Wynn will be rolling off the Vestry this year. We are all so appreciative of their service. We are grateful to Mary Christian, Leslie Tidwell, and Bronwyn Young for agreeing to be our new Vestry members beginning in 2023. For all their hard work in finances, thank you to Beth Woods and Mike Tarnoff.

There were SO many others that bless our Parish with their time, talent, and treasures. It just is not possible to thank everyone. From Altar Guild to Ushers and everything in between, the life of this church is its wonderful people. Thank you to all of you! Also, while I am expressing gratitude.....I know I speak for all members of this Parish when I give a special thanks to Jesse Underwood who is always there when we need him!

At the end of 2022, we found ourselves close to business as usual. Yet, there is a new appreciation for our ability to gather together and work on common goals. We have accomplished so many of our goals, with some items remaining on our project list for 2023. We will be looking at such things as acquiring Holly House, possible new signage, upgrading the organ, and more. The partnership with our neighbors and our community is high on our list of priorities. We face the future in a spirit of true fellowship and trusting in God that we will do his will to further our mission in our Church and our Community. We ask for your prayers so that we may all serve this Parish, our Community, and our Lord with gladness and singleness of heart.

#### **Deacon's Report**

Throughout our transition back to being the "new normal" All Saints, we realized that we didn't know our closest neighbors along Cherokee Street very well. It gently roared to our attention one day when someone called us on her cell phone. She needed to find out if we could help her with her utilities. She lives on Cherokee and had been knocking on the back door for quite some time because that was the door she thought she would use. We instead directed her to the front door of the Christian Education building. It was clear that we needed to get to know our neighbors so that we can truly be a neighbor.

Since then we have hand-delivered invitations to our family-friendly services and events. Trunk or Treat was revived and well attended by many folks from the neighborhood as well as All Saints. Our next adventure is planned for Shrove Tuesday with the traditional pancake supper

and a kid-friendly mini Mardi Gras. Oh, and there is now a sign on the back door directing our neighbors to the front door, where they have always belonged.

Through our efforts to build community relationships for ministry, we have begun attending meetings of the new Homeless Coalition of Warner Robins. This program's goal is to move towards providing our sisters and brothers who lay their heads under the stars a safe, secure, place to stay and engage them in ways to help them prepare for a more secure way of life. This program has been initiated by Mayor LaRhonda Patrick. At a recent meeting in December joined people from the Mayor's office, the Board of Commissioners, Police and Sheriffs Department, United Way, city representatives from both Centerville and Perry, various agencies, and several churches. The focus of the meeting was to get to know each other, share how we are already engaging in homelessness challenges, what we would like to see, and how we can work towards helping our sisters and brothers work for security and stability. I'm thrilled that All Saints will be involved in supporting the temporary warming center at The Place this winter: a beginning of a multi-pronged approach to a complex problem.

In 2023, All Saints will continue growing our ministry in our community. We're regularly learning more about how to assist others with gaining official identity documents. We're committed to finding ways to engage our neighbors in a meaningful relationship that is fun when it can be and serious when it needs to be. And, of course we will continue to build our relationships with the Homeless Coalition, living into our Christian mission of carrying Christ's light into the world by treating all others with compassion, dignity, and respect.

Through all of our ministry this past year we have discovered something interesting. There aren't any coincidences. Embracing one opportunity to love like Jesus flows into the next. We just have to be open, feel the nudge, and respond in love.

#### Junior Warden's Report

The year 2022 was a busy year. We started with a workday in the Spring doing work on the outside, plumbing repairs, and replacing lights on the inside: a busy day, but very productive. Sometimes it's just repairing/replacing the little things that make our life a little bit easier. The nursery door was completely replaced including a new door knob and lock. The garbage disposal in the parish hall kitchen sort of came "apart" so it too was replaced. When the kitchen and parish hall filled with smoke from cooking sausages, it was time to reinvestigate repair or replacement of the exhaust fan over the stove. It was determined to be beyond repair but as the replacement was almost \$6,000, it was tabled for now. Our newest HVAC system wasn't cooling right, so a repairman came out and luckily, that system was under warranty, that's when we also found out one of the systems in that trio had stopped working completely, so it was replaced as well. Just before Easter, new pine straw was put down to make things pretty again and all the buildings (including our lovely cross) were power washed. It looked so beautiful for Easter. The ice maker in the parish hall kitchen was working sometimes and then not at all, so a repairman come out and said it was working but in serious need of a good cleaning. When he was done he suggested an annual service contract to keep it cleaned which in turn would keep it in good working order (already noted for 2023 vestry consideration). A grant was submitted to replace the remaining lights to make lighting more energy efficient and a partial award from GIPL was received.

It was a pleasure to serve as your Junior Warden this year. Remembering that our buildings and grounds are the hub of our common life and ministry, we must always be diligent to care for them.

# Treasurer's Report

All Saints remains in good financial position. Your Vestry continues to be good stewards of God's gifts. For 2022, we managed to meet church missions ahead of budget, meaning, we spent less than we budgeted.

- Our expenses for 2022 were \$237,390 against a budget of \$250,656, highlighting the conscientious efforts of your Vestry and Finance Committee to use God's gifts.
- During 2023 All Saints has plans to purchase the Holly House, adjacent to our current church. The Vestry will continue to solicit ideas for its use to help our church grow in the Warner Robins community.
- We received a grant from the Georgia Interfaith Power and Light to assist us in reducing our energy costs. We have obtained an additional GIPL grant funding to continue the changeover to more cost efficient lighting in 2023..
- We plan to replace another of our aging heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) systems. This endeavor will further reduce overall energy consumption.
- We have seen increases in our maintenance of grounds and buildings, as well as in our office expenses.

Overall, All Saints remains in solid financial position, allowing God to continue God's work in our church and surrounding community.

### Book Club

During 2022, the Monday Book Study Group has met regularly on Monday afternoons on Zoom (with a few pauses during the summer) to discuss texts that cover a wide range of topics related to faith and scripture. Our books this year have included:

- Kissing Fish: Christianity For People Who Don't Like Christianity, by Roger Wolsey
- Short Stories By Jesus: The Enigmatic Parables of a Controversial Rabbi, by Amy-Jill Levine

- Saving Grace: Speak Your Truth, Stay Centered, And Learn to Coexist with the People Who Drive You Nuts, by Kirsten Powers
- Wise Blood, by Flannery O'Connor
- Heavy Burdens: Seven Ways LGBTQ Christians experience Harm in the Church, by Bridget Rivera
- The Misunderstood Jew: The Church and the Scandal of the Jewish Jesus, by Amy-Jill Levine (discussion still in progress)

In addition to our Zoom meetings and occasional in-person book discussions, several of our members made a literary pilgrimage in July to Eatonton and Milledgeville to visit the Georgia Writers Museum and the homes of Flannery O'Connor and Alice Walker.

Several of our members have also been active in planning and hosting the church's Celebrating the Saints gatherings, commemorating Christian literary figures such as George Herbert, John Donne, Christina Rossetti, G. K. Chesterton, John Bunyan, and C. S. Lewis. These events typically begin with Morning Prayer, followed by a potluck brunch and a reading and exploration of selected poems or stories by the writer we are celebrating. We plan to continue these gatherings in the coming year, though specific dates and locations are still to be determined, and the people we will be commemorating are still under discussion.

During 2023, we plan to continue to meet on Zoom on Monday afternoons. We are shifting to an earlier gathering time, 4 pm. As of the start of the year, we are discussing Chapter 2 of Levine's *Misunderstood Jew*. When we have finished that book, we plan to focus on *Caste: The Origin of our Discontents*, by Isabel Wilkerson, and then *Can I Get a Witness?: Reading Revelation through African-American Culture*, by Brian K. ### Family Promise

All Saints continued its support of Family Promise of Greater Houston County throughout 2022. Generally, we provide an evening meal approximately 3 times per quarter for a total of 12 meals per year. We have also continued to partner with Trinity United Methodist Church. Meal sign-up was done through SignUpGenius. Trained Volunteers delivered the meals to the Family Promise Facility in Perry, Georgia. The volunteers set up the dinner and then shared the meal with the families.

Families that were served met the criteria established by Family Promise. They had minor children, were employed and went through a background check and drug check. During their stay, they worked with the employees of Family Promise to establish a budget and save funds to establish a home after they graduated from the program. Some families needed help with things such as medical issues and car repairs. Several families were able to complete the

program and return to independent living. All Saints was blessed to be a part of helping these families make such a positive life change for them and their children.

### Food Pantry

Our Food Pantry has continued to faithfully support the local community each Tuesday from 9:30 - 11:00 a.m. This important work can only be done with a faithful team of Food Pantry volunteers, including: Ashley Adams, Lillian Burton, Melissa and Brooklyn Crow, Jimmy Eubanks, Winnie Goldston, Sandy Lee, Darlene Meloche, Mischa McNeese, Dawn Ray, Mike Tarnoff, the entire Turner Family (Rich, Libbet, and sons, James and Simon), and Jess Underwood. And we are blessed to have others who also volunteer periodically during the year.

Volunteers help on Mondays by picking up donated food from Publix. On Tuesdays, other volunteers help check in our clients and distribute food. Other days, additional volunteers keep our shelves stocked with both donated food and Macon Food Bank purchases, helping to insure that those pre-packing food bags for distribution have everything they need. Our Food Pantry also provides extra food bags for Thanksgiving and Christmas distribution. It's a true team effort to serve the wider community!

In 2022, the Food Pantry helped 860 families consisting of a total of 2,816 family members. Of those families helped, All Saints also provided additional food assistance for the 442 families with children under 18 years of age. These numbers reflect an increase in assistance in all categories from 2021.

Funding for our Food Pantry continues through generous donations of individuals, both within and outside our Parish, and the ECW. Thanks to all who support this important All Saints ministry. Your generosity with time, talent, and treasure is what keeps this ministry running smoothly.

#### Rector's Discretionary Fund Assistance

With the generous gifts of this community and some logistical support from the Breaking Barriers team of Deacon Barbara and Ellen Strait, we have been able to increase our availability to support our neighbors. 
